



BOARDMAN TO HEMINGWAY (B2H)

- +290 mile, 500-kilovolt line connects two regions – the Pacific Northwest and the Mountain West which utilize energy on different cycles.
- +This project will deliver affordable northwest energy to Idaho Power customers in the heat of summer.
- + General Mitigation Agreement from Idaho Power is still being finalized

GATEWAY WEST

- +Multi-segment 1,000 mile, 230- and 500-kV transmission line stretching through Wyoming and southern Idaho
- + Helps Idaho Power move energy efficiently between the Treasure Valley and Magic Valley, and import energy from outside our service area to meet customer needs

SOUTHWEST INTERTIE PROJECT (SWIP) NORTH

- + Proposed 285-mile, 500-kV transmission line will run from eastern Nevada to the Midpoint Station near Twin Falls
- An import only line to bring in low-cost and abundant energy from the southwest, especially during winter months
- +Will go over the top of the Toano freight road

JEFFREYS-GOODALE CUTOFF OUTING


- +August 23 Craters of the Moon

Canyon Creek Contribution: The total project cost is approximately \$40,000. It was proposed to contribute up to \$2,000 from the new Special Project account as matching contributions. 501(c)(3) contributions must be made through OCTA National. A motion to accept the proposal was made, seconded, and passed by unanimous voice vote.






